

Privacy Policy

The purpose of this policy is to fulfill our obligation to inform individuals accessing our public facing website who we are and what we do, what information of theirs may be secured in their visit and the rights that they have in controlling any subsequent use of that information. Our obligations beyond corporate communication is defined in law.

Introduction

This is the privacy policy for xydus.com. We are committed to maintaining the privacy and confidentiality of any personal information we collect.

We may use your personal information: to improve our services; to maintain our business operations; and to exercise, defend or establish our rights. Should we ask you to provide certain information by which you can be identified when using our website, any use of your information will be in accordance with this policy.

Changes to the privacy policy

If we decide to change our privacy policy we will post the changes here. If the changes are significant, we may also choose to email all our registered users with the new details. If required by law, we will get your permission or give you the opportunity to opt out of any new uses of your data. Changes were made in May, 2018 reflecting changes in the law known as General Data Protection Regulation (also known as the GDPR) and the UK Data Protection Act, 2018. Changes in November, 2018 reflect updates to our use and notification of cookies.

This privacy policy explains how we collect, use, share or transfer your personal information when you use this website.

Types of personal information:

- your name, job title, contact information including email address;
- information about the type of device you are using including IP address and the device's identifiers, your browser type and language;
- information relating to how you use our site including referring and exit pages.

Who we are and how to contact us

What personal data we collect and how we use it

Registration and use information – When you register to use our Services, we will collect Personal Data as necessary to offer and fulfill the Services you request. Depending on the Services you choose, we may require you to provide us with your name, postal address, telephone number, email address and identification information. We may require you to provide us with additional Personal Data as you use our Services.

- Information that you choose to provide us to obtain additional Services or specific online Services – If you request or participate in an optional Site feature, or request enhanced Services or other elective functionality, we may collect additional information from you. We will provide you with a separate notice at the time of collection, if the use of that information differs from the uses disclosed in this privacy policy.
- Information about you from third-party sources – We may obtain information from third-party sources, where permitted by law.
- Other information we collect related to your use of our Sites or Services – We may collect additional information from or about you when you communicate with us, contact our customer support teams or respond to a survey.

What we do with the information we gather

We require this information to understand your needs, facilitate our services, and for the following reasons:

- We may process data about your use of our website and services. The usage data may include your IP address, geographical location, browser type and version, operating system, referral source, length of visit, page views and website navigation paths, as well as information about the timing, frequency and pattern of your service use. The source of the usage data is our analytics tracking system. This usage data may be processed for the purposes of analysing the use of the website and services. The legal basis for this processing is mainly monitoring and improving our website and services.

- We may process your account data. The account data may include your name and email address. The account data may be processed for the purposes of operating our website, providing our services, ensuring the security of our website and services, maintaining back-ups of our databases and communicating with you. The legal basis for this processing is the proper administration of our website and business
- We may process information contained in any enquiry you submit to us. The enquiry data may be processed to improve our services to you.
- We may process information that you provide to us for the purpose of subscribing to our email notifications or newsletters.
- Please do not supply any other person's personal data to us.

International transfers of your personal data

We have offices and facilities that are overseas. The European Commission has made an adequacy decision with respect to the data protection laws of each of these countries. Where operationally essential, transfers to each of these countries will be protected by appropriate safeguards, namely the use of data protection standards that are approved by the European Commission.

Retaining and deleting personal data

Personal data that we process for any reason shall not be kept for longer than is necessary for the purpose. In some cases, it is not possible for us to specify in advance the periods for which your personal data will be retained. In such cases, we will determine the period of retention based on the specific task. We may retain your personal data where such retention is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation to which we are subject, or in order to protect your vital interests or the vital interests of another natural person.

Your rights

Your principal rights under data protection law are:

- the right to access;
- the right to rectification;
- the right to erasure;
- the right to restrict processing;
- the right to object to processing;
- the right to complain to a supervisory authority; and
- the right to withdraw consent.

Internal record keeping

- We may use the information to improve our products and services.
- We may periodically send promotional emails about new products, special offers or other information which we think you may find interesting using the email address which you have provided.
- From time to time, we may also use your information to contact you for market research purposes. We may contact you by email, we may use the information to customize the website according to your interests.

Sharing personal information with third parties

How we use cookies

What are Cookies

A cookie is a small file which asks permission to be placed on your computer's hard drive. Once you agree, the file is added and the cookie helps analyze web traffic or lets you know when you visit a particular site. Cookies allow web applications to respond to you as an individual. The web application can tailor its operations to your needs, likes and dislikes by gathering and remembering information about your preferences.
